Highlights for sharing

Issues you wish Land Management to discuss

1. Pedestrian gate and Entrance. Requests for a Countryside Park Entrance Sign.

2. Dog waste bins and dog 'matters' in the park.

(a) can we know when second dog bin is to be installed?

(b) there is a gap in the CSP westside fence where dogs off leads have run into a Neighbour's Garden. Is the PC allowed to fix this gap?

(c) the CSP Group noted that dogs off leads are a possible threat to wildlife (e.g. Deer and small mammals) in the park. Could there be placed on the park notice board 'guidance for users' of park – to cover dog safety, wildlife safety etc.

3. Please can the PC let us know when then Bike rack is to be installed?

4. Maintenance task in park.

Group would like to know at which stage is PC with maintenance of Country Park Benches.

5. Car Park.

(a) CSP group view was the PC needs to contact NCC County Farms and ask what is acceptable material in Car Park and identify a likely grant source (e.g. from the Lottery fund)?

(b) PC also needs a sign to say to drivers they '**enter and park car at own risk**'.

(c) A notice is needed to state **no overnight park** (as camper vans have parked recently overnight).
