Acle Beat Team Priority Setting Meeting:

Our last Priority setting meeting was held on March 17th 2026, hosted by the Acle Methodist Church. The hybrid meetings of in person and with the choice to join online is working really well. We are always on the look out for venues to host our meetings, so please get in touch if you have a suitable venue. We try to move them around the area as much as possible, this also includes Old Catton, Sprowston and Thorpe St Andrew.

These meetings are to invite any person to come along and talk to us about local policing issues.

Following the last meeting our priority moving forward will be **Road Safety**.

Road Safety:

The Team have conducted the first Road Safety operation of the year whereby we chose a problematic road, drawn from community complaints and targeted this for speeding offences and other motoring offenses identified. This one was conducted during the hours of darkness as that's what the information suggested were the problematic times. Although this time round the concentration was on Sprowston, Thorpe and Lingwood, please do let us know if speeding is an issue in your area.

We will be arranging further Road Safety operations over the coming months, car meets and the ASB that comes with them are of a particular priority over the summer months and we are working very closely with Broadland District Council on this. There is currently a Public Space Protection Order for the whole of Broadland helping to combat these issues.

We also have very good communication links with the Sugar Beat factory, Highways and the A47 Project team if there is anything to address.

Over the summer months the Acle Beat Team will be at various village and school events across the area, it's the time of year we look forward to the most as we get to meet lots of people across the community. In the last month we met with the children at Snowy's Nursery, we do this every year and very much enjoy letting the children dress up and pretend to be police officers, let them explore the police car and teach them even at that young age, how much we are there to help people.

Crime stats for first 3 months of this year – January to March. 2026

10 - Theft from Shops.

3 - Common Assaults - one due to Mental Health. One between young people with no injury and one related an incident of theft from shops.

1 - Blackmail – no suspect identified

1 - Non fatal strangulation – domestic related

1 - Criminal damage – slashed tyres. No suspect identified
