

BRUNDALL BIODIVERSITY

Brundall Parish Council's Biodiversity Working Group (BWG) is planning to develop several 'Biodiversity Improvement Areas' in the village to enhance the biodiversity of the area. These areas will be created from small parcels of amenity grassland by repurposing them as wildflower sites. Wildflowers are important contributors to biodiversity as they attract a wide range of bees, butterflies and other insects. They provide a source of food for pollinators and are a key component of the natural ecosystem. Brundall Cemetery was selected as the first site to establish a Biodiversity Improvement Area. Starting in the Autumn of 2025, two areas at the cemetery were prepared and planted and seeded with a variety of wildflowers. During the spring of 2026, these areas developed successfully into new wildflower meadows containing a wide variety of species including, Cornflower, Flax, Poppy, Ox-eye daisy and Borage. Following on from this success, BWG plans to establish similar biodiversity improvement areas at other suitable sites in the village, thus creating a network of sites covering the parish and making a significant contribution to its biodiversity.
